

What is Childlink?

Childlink is a source of information on children, young people and families in the UK and Ireland. Topics covered include Welfare, Education, Health and Justice. Types of resource accessible through this service include Statistics, Research Papers, Acts of Parliament, Law Reports and News stories. Over one million pages of information are available.

1. How can I access it?


- In Internet Explorer, type in the address below:

- To use this site from outside college, choose 'Login via your home institution', select 'Hull College Group (Shibboleth)' and log in using your College network username and password.

2. Searching

- Type the words you want to search for in the box on the right-hand side of the page.
- Use the advanced search option to narrow your search down by type of information, Childlink section, or region.
- Click on [Search](#).

3. Viewing and using your search results

- Your search results will be listed as a series of headings followed by an extract from the information source. Results are sorted by date with the most recent at the top.
- Click on a heading to view more information. Some items will open as another web page, others in a new window as an Acrobat document.
- To print a web page, click on [Printer-friendly version](#) at the bottom of the screen, then select File and Print.

4. Browsing

- The menus provided on the left-hand side of the screen allows you to browse through a variety of topics.

- **Topics** lets you look through news items and government papers, subdivided by region and subject – Welfare, Education, Health, Justice, Youth and Employment. Items are listed in chronological order.

- **Resources** lets you look for particular kinds of information – News, Government Papers, Official Statistics, Research Papers, Legislation, Parliamentary Questions and Debates, Benefit information, relevant Case Law and video clips. Items are listed in chronological order. Also included is a section called ‘Library’ which provides publication details and brief summaries of books published in this field. There is also a section called ‘Featured Cases’ which brings together information on special child-related cases or events in the media.
