

## What is The Guardian & Observer Archive?

The Guardian/Observer Archive offers online access to hundreds of thousands of articles and features through a simple web interface. You can now search more than nine years of The Guardian and over five years of The Observer. New stories are added to the Archive within 48 hours of publication. The Guardian/Observer Archive also includes a link to The Guardian's own News Unlimited web site, adding the current day's news and comment to the Archive's coverage that dates back to 1990.

## How can I access it?


- From a College PC: in Internet Explorer, type in the address below:

- From outside the College: go the Information and Libraries section of Moodle. Open the 'List of E-Resources' and click on the link.

- Type word(s) you would like to search for in the box.
- Click on **Search**

**NB:** This searches for articles published in the last 3-9 months. Use the **Advanced Search** to search for older articles.

## To View your results

When you search for the information you want, you are given a list of articles

- The results are sorted with the most recent first.
- Click on relevance to sort with the most relevant first
- To read the full text of an article click on the title. The words you searched on will be highlighted in red.

You can print the article or e-mail it to yourself

## Advanced Search

- As well as general keywords, the advanced search allows you to search for words in an article or by author name
- Choose how you want to search:
  - All of these terms
  - Any of these terms
  - Exact phrase

#### Publication/Section

- You can also select a range of dates e.g. From 1 April 2002 to 31 March 2003
- You can also choose to search only a particular section of the paper

## View Newspaper Issue

- You can use the View Newspaper Issue feature to quickly locate a copy of a The Guardian or The Observer on a particular day.
- Select the day, month and year of the issue you are looking for.
- Click the List articles button.

### View Newspaper Issue

Select the day, month and year and click the List articles button to view articles for the relevant issue.

## Search Hints

- All searches are case-insensitive, so you don't have to know whether a word should be capitalised or not. For example, there is no difference between Carr, carr or CaRr.
- You don't have to divide up the words with a comma. Simply a space between your words will do.
- Accented letters can be found by typing the unaccented form: e.g. to search for **rôle** you can type **role**.
- There is no need to type AND or + into the search box. Just use the option of **All of these terms**. The Quick search defaults to this option.
- To do a quick search for a phrase, use quotation marks e.g. "pop art"
