

What is Moodle?

Moodle provides access to a wide variety of teaching and learning resources specifically designed for Hull College students and staff. These include online tutorials and tests, helpsheets, message boards and discussion groups. Moodle can also be used to access e-resources.

1. How can I access it?

1. If you are using a College computer, double-click on the Moodle icon on the desktop. You should be logged on automatically:
2. From outside the College, follow the link from the College home page or go to the following website:



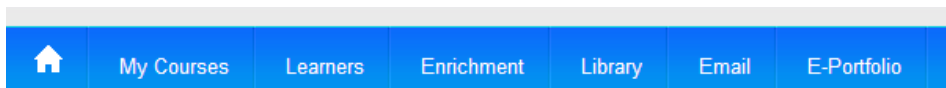

- Log in using the login box on the right-hand side of the screen.
- Your User ID is your **Student Number**.
- Your Password will be the same one that you use to access the College network.

2. Navigating through Moodle

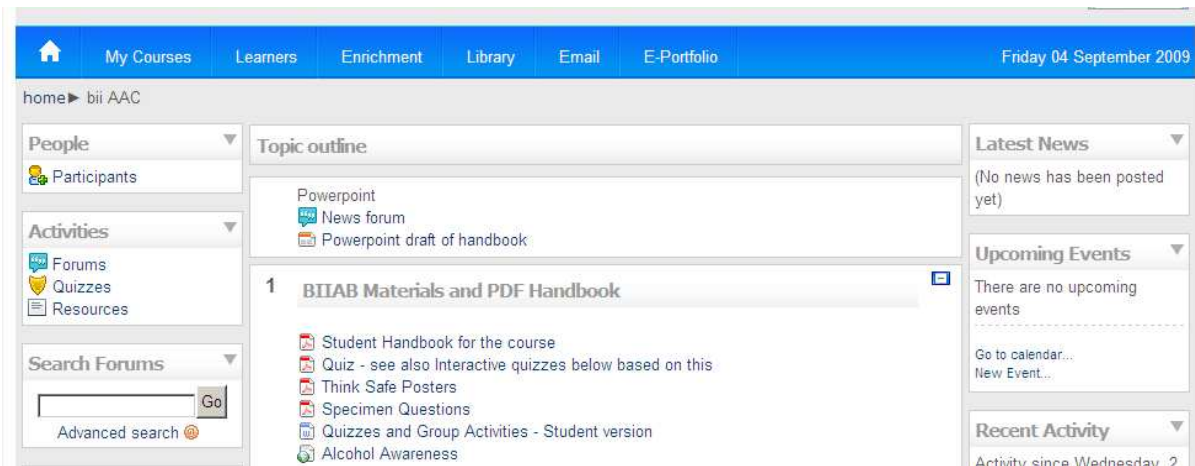
The Moodle front page has a student message board, and links on the left-hand side to other information.

Once you have logged on, you can use the blue menu bar at the top of the screen to go to other parts of Moodle, or to access your Email and E-Portfolio accounts:



- When you log on to Moodle for the first time, click on the 'Learners' button and then choose [All courses](#) from the drop-down menu. Then find your course. (You may also need an enrolment key from your tutor to access your course page).
- After you have done this, your course will be listed when you click on 'My courses'.
- Click on the 'Library' button to go to the Information and Libraries Moodle page. This has information about how to use the Library and the College Network, and has links to a wide variety of electronic sources of information.

Here is an example of a course page on Moodle:



- Any news items or events relating to your course will be shown on the right-hand side of the page.
- Your course may provide a **Forum** where students and staff can communicate with one another. Click on a forum title to enter it.
- Your course may provide **Quizzes** where you can test your knowledge in relation to a particular subject area. Results can be recorded so you can check them at a future date. Click on a quiz title to start.
- Your course may provide **Resources** in a variety of forms such as Word documents, PowerPoint presentations and web links. Click on a resource title to open it. Remember that useful information for all courses can also be found by going to the [Library](#) page.
- You can return to the Moodle Home Page by clicking on the [home](#) icon in the top left-hand corner of the page.

3. *Logging Out*

- To conclude your Moodle session, click on the [logout](#) link displayed in the top right hand corner of the screen.
